SchoolCash Online

Pre-Primary and School Events

There have been some questions around how pre-primary students are integrated into the events we have at school. On days when school staff are engaged in PD, there will be no pre-primary program those days. As well, all school holidays are observed in pre-primary.

Any curriculum-based events (curriculum parent/teacher...) are not pre-primary events as there is no curriculum being followed for those students. If you have any questions or concerns your lead ECE is available via email.

Pre-Primaries are welcome to participate in other school events such as Home and School events, hot lunch and the milk program. If you ever have questions about participation, please call our main line 902-435-8435 to inquire.

Picking Up Students from School

All student pickups will continue to take place outside. If you are picking up students from school at dismissal time, please meet them at their regular entrance doors.

If you are picking up students outside of dismissal time, please follow the directions below:

- Call the school when you are on your way to the school to let them know who you are picking up and what class they are in. 902-435-8435
- Buzz the doorbell when you arrive.
- Your child will be brought to you at the front door.

Picking up from pre-primary, you must knock on the door of the appropriate pre-primary class.

Water Filling Stations

Several new water filling stations were in August 2021. The drinking water from the filling stations has been tested and is safe to drink. Please have your children bring water bottles to fill. We do not have a supply of cups for students to use. Students should bring their own labelled water bottles. If students do not bring a water bottle, they will not have anything to drink water out of.

Allergy Alerts / Medication

Please keep in mind we have numerous students and staff with severe allergies to food and scents. Please refrain from wearing scents when in our school and be diligent about the food items your child brings to school. Nut products cannot be sent to school.

If your child requires medication to be given during school time, an "Administration of Medicine" form must be filled out. All medicine is kept secured and distributed from the main office or learning centre. Medications are required to be in the original container and clearly labelled for your child.

If your child has a severe or life-threatening allergy or medical condition, a photograph of your child and an alert will be kept in the office, staff room, and classroom to ensure all staff members have access to this information. It is also important that you call the school to obtain the appropriate medical forms. This is important to ensure all staff is aware of any conditions or allergies so they can respond appropriately in the case of an emergency. You must complete a form indicating appropriate medical care for your child.

If your child requires an Epi Pen, they must wear their Epi Pen on their person. If you decide that you do not want your child to wear the Epi Pen, it can be left in the office but you must sign a waiver as well. If you want to send in a second Epi Pen, it can be left in the main school office.

If you require a Medic Alert bracelet, Medic Alert will provide children between the ages of 4 and 14 with a free medic alert bracelet. Please call the school and ask for a pamphlet.

Hot Lunch - Pizza Tuesdays

We will continue our pizza lunches each **Tuesday** beginning in October. The orders will be collected once a month. Students must order for the entire month. We cannot accommodate partial orders. We also will not accept any late orders.

All orders are made using our on-line ordering system through School Cash Online.

Pizza will cost \$4 per week and Crazy bread will cost \$3. There will be an option for families to purchase pizza for students who may need assistance purchasing hot lunch. Last year that went a long way to ensure that all students who wanted hot lunch received it. Many thanks to our generous community who thinks about ALL the students who attend our school.

If your child is absent on Little Caesar day, their order will be kept for one day. Students can pick their pizza from the main office the following day. Because Little Caesars pizzas are pre-ordered, we are unable to reimburse or carry over Little Caesar orders if students are absent. If school is **cancelled** on a pizza Tuesday, the cost of your order for that day will be refunded, in the manner in which it was paid. These refunds **only** apply to school cancellations as we are permitted to cancel that order with Little Caesars.

<u>Ordering Dates</u> - on-line orders open on September 19th and close on September 27th. **Please be reminded that no late orders will be accepted.**

Hot Lunch - R&B Kitchen Thursdays

We are trying out a new **Thursday** option for Hot Lunch. This year we are going to order from a R&B Kitchen, locally owned business. The orders will be collected once a month. Students must order for the entire month. We cannot accommodate partial orders. We also will not accept any late orders.

All orders are made using our on-line ordering system through School Cash Online.

All options will be \$5. You can choose from spaghetti and meatballs or BBQ chicken and mac & cheese. There will be an option for families to make a purchase for students who may need assistance purchasing hot lunch. Last year that went a long way to ensure that all students who wanted hot lunch received it. Many thanks to our generous community who thinks about ALL the students who attend our school.

As with pizza orders, if your child is absent on R&B Kitchen day, their order will be kept for one day. Students can pick their lunch from the main office the following day. Because hot lunches are pre-ordered, we are unable to reimburse or carry over lunch orders if students are absent. If school is **cancelled** on a Thursday, the cost of your order for that day will be refunded, in the manner in which it was paid. These refunds **only** apply to school cancellations as we are permitted to cancel that order with R&B Kitchen.

<u>Ordering Dates</u> - on-line orders open on September 13th and close on September 21th. Please be reminded that no late orders will be accepted.

School Photos

This year, school photos will be taken by Adams Photography. Our photo day will be on Friday September 29th. Retake date is October 23. We want to let you know in advance that we **will not** be taking family photos this year.

Safe Arrival

On days when your child will be late or absent, please be sure to let us know. One of our greatest priorities is ensuring that all our students arrive safely at school each day. Our school is continuing to use a new system to report absences through SchoolMessenger. You are able to report future absences using an app, website, or toll-free phone number. Any time your student is absent (or late after 8:45) and the absence has not been reported in advance, you will receive notifications via email, text, and phone calls from SchoolMessenger. If SchoolMessenger cannot reach you, office staff will follow up.

Moving forward, to report your student absences, any of the following methods can be used:

PowerSchool Parent/Student Portal

Parents/guardians can log in to https://sishrsb.ednet.ns.ca/public/ to access the SchoolMessenger website to report future absences.

SchoolMessenger App

Parents/guardians can download the SchoolMessenger app for Android and iOS devices and use their username and password for the PowerSchool Portal.

Toll-Free Number

Parents/guardians can call 1-833-582-6940 to report future absences using an automated system.

All three methods are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Absences can be reported at any time before the start of school on the day the student will be absent. Up to five consecutive absences can be recorded at once.

Lost and Found

Just a reminder to have your child(ren) take any of their lost items from the Lost and Found each week. Once a month, we will be donating all items in the Lost and Found to charity. We do not have the space and capacity to keep lost and found items for long periods of time. Please have your child(ren) check the lost and found on a regular basis. It is also important that your child's name is written on their clothing. As we go through the lost and found items for donation, we do check for student names.

Arrival and School Bell Times

Please note: at 8:35 inside supervision begins and students can begin to enter the building; instruction begins at 8:45 and all students should be at school by that time; ALL grades dismiss for the day at 2:35pm. **Students may not be on school grounds before 8:35am.**

Our bells indicate the start of the school day at 8:45 and the end of the school day at 2:35. We have no other bells during the school day.

It is extremely important that families make arrangements to pick up students at 2:35. We do not have supervision for students after the 2:35 bell.

Registration Forms & Parent Contact Information

It is extremely important that all families have a Power School account to verify and confirm the information contained in your child's electronic file. Families will be asked to verify and update their child's electronic file each year. We will be sending more information about how to do this later on this month.

Head Lice Reminders

We encourage parents to make checking their child's head for the presence of nits and/or lice a regular part of their routine. Please notify the school if your child has head lice and provide the recommended treatment before returning to school. Call 8-1-1 at any time to speak with a Registered Nurse for more information and guidance if head lice are still present after the second treatment. Communication

Communication is extremely important for our homeschool relationship and for the positive development of your child. We strive to work in partnership with families. Sharing what you know of your child helps us provide the most supportive learning environment for him/her. We are happy to answer questions, clarify information and listen to what you have to share.

Breakfast Basket

We are fortunate and happy to offer a breakfast food for students at our school. Please note that we will continue to offer an in-class breakfast basket with healthy food items. Students may enjoy breakfast items including granola bars, yogurt, fresh fruit, and cheese strings directly from their class baskets each morning.

Lockdown Drill

The safety and security of our students and staff is a top priority for *lan Forsyth Elementary* and the Halifax Regional Centre for Education. We implement a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn.

One of the procedures our school will be practicing is a lockdown drill. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured, and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked, and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building.

Students are kept inside the school and classrooms when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill. These drills should be treated with the same level of importance as fire drills.

Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. When possible, our School Liaison Officer

may assist us in conducting the lockdown drills just as the Fire Department assists with evacuation drills from time to time.

Please take the time to speak with your child about this procedure and reinforce its importance. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning.

Our first lockdown drill will take place on September 20 sometime before recess. Please contact principal, Angela Yerxa if you have any questions about lockdown drills.

Other School Safety Items

Please help to keep our students safe when dropping off and picking up your children. Here are a few friendly reminders:

- Please do not ever drive on the school grounds when students are present (8:15 to 3:00).
- The pylons along both driveways of the school are in place to allow students safe passage on to the school yard. Do not drive past them.
- Parking on the school grounds is limited to staff.
- When parking on the street, please abide by the nostopping zones on either side of the street. Parking can only take place on side streets or further away from the school. It is especially important to abide by this during drop-off and pick-up times as parking or stopping in front of the school makes it impossible for school busses to drop-off or pick up students.
- Do not block bus zones or no-stopping zones as indicated by pylons
- Dogs are not permitted on school yard or playgrounds while students are present. We appreciate your cooperation with this!

Emailed Newsletters

We email Monthly newsletters to families. It is extremely important that we have an accurate and working email address for your family. If we do not any school communication will not reach you. If you do require a paper copy of the newsletter, please contact Ms. Hannaby at the main office and we will provide one.

Student Lunches

Please be reminded that we are not able to heat lunches for students. It would be very helpful if you could include spoons and forks (where needed) with your children. <u>We</u> do not have any plastic spoons or forks for students.

As well, we are limiting the amount of interaction for drop of student lunches. Please try to send a lunch with your child everyday so we are not opening the front door throughout the morning and accepting lunches on a daily basis. We are not accepting **Skip the Dishes** or **Uber Eats type** food delivery for student lunches.

Milk

Milk orders will go home this week. We will have three ordering periods: Order 1 runs from September 20 - December 13 (online ordering opens Sept 13 and closes Sept 19); Order 2 runs from December 14 - March 19 (online ordering opens Dec 5 and closes Dec 12); and Order 3 runs from March 20 - June 3 (online ordering opens March 8 and closes March 18)
