Message from Principal

As the winter season approaches, we want to ensure the well-being and comfort of our elementary school students during their time at school. With colder temperatures expected, we kindly request that you dress your child in layers to help them stay warm and cozy throughout the day.

Layering is essential to adapt to varying temperatures both indoors and outdoors. Please ensure your child wears a warm base layer, such as a long-sleeved shirt, along with a sweater or fleece for added insulation. Don't forget a weather-appropriate jacket or coat for outdoor activities. Encouraging your child to wear layers provides them the flexibility to adjust their clothing throughout the day as the temperature fluctuates.

Additionally, we recommend including a hat and gloves to protect against chilly winds during outdoor recess. By working together, we can create a comfortable and safe environment for our students to thrive academically and socially. Thank you for your cooperation in keeping our little ones snug during the colder months.

HRCE guidelines state that student safety is a priority and when deciding to take students outside, we need to consider several factors such as: are students dressed in warm clothing, how long they will be outdoors, will they be standing or playing, is there sunshine... At IFES, we feel that students should, generally, enjoy outdoor play when temperatures are above - 10°C. If the <u>wind-chill</u> is at -20°C or colder, students will remain indoors.

We do check the temperature on local weather sites during the winter months. Please help us keep your kids safe by monitoring your child's clothing so that they will be adequately dressed to go outside during the cold weather. For student's safety and supervision purposes, please remind your child that it is expected that they are outside during all outside recess times.

School and Bus Cancellation

The Halifax Regional Centre for Education takes great care when making the decision to alter the normal operations of schools in the event of severe or inclement weather. Decisions on school closures and/or bus cancellations are posted on the board's website at https://www.hrce.ca/, on Twitter at

www.twitter.com/HRSB_Official, recorded on 464-INFO (4636) and communicated to all local radio stations. You can also receive notice of school and bus cancellations by e-mail or text message by following the link on the front page (left side) of the HRCE website.

We are in the <u>Woodlawn High School</u> Family of Schools. Please listen and or look for either the Family name or the individual name of the school in all announcements.

Delayed Opening of Schools

On school days when conditions exist that it is not safe to open schools at regularly scheduled time but it is predicted that conditions will improve, a **2 hour delayed** opening may be considered. Delayed openings would be considered when a severe weather event has concluded, but snow clearing or other operations require additional time. Delayed opening may also be considered when the building is experiencing and issue (power, water) and additional time is required to prepare the facility for opening. In the event of a delayed opening the following will apply:

- School opening will be delayed 2 hours
- <u>lan Forsyth Elementary would open at 10:35 am</u>
- School bus pick up times will be delayed 2 hours
- At schools that have Excel, the program will be delayed opening by 2 hours
- Each school will alter morning schedules to best address their timetables
- Lunch times will not change
- Afternoon class schedules will not change
- Dismissal time will not change

Mid-Day School Closure

In the event of mid-day closure due to deteriorating weather, you will be informed on local radio stations as close to 11:00 a.m. as possible. Staff will contact parents (or the person you have previously indicated) via the phone number recorded on in PowerSchool. It is essential that we are able to reach you in the event of a school closure during the day. If your child is transported on a Stock Transportation school bus, those busses will be departing from school two hours earlier than normal on mid-day closure days. Therefore, Stock busses will depart Ian Forsyth at 12:35 in the case of a mid-day closure. Due to changing weather conditions some busses may be delayed.

Please note that at the elementary level we need to contact parents directly before we dismiss students to walk or take a bus. If the classroom teacher is unable to reach a parent or designate of a particular child, that child will remain at school until contact with a parent or guardian is made.

Allergy Alerts / Medication

Please keep in mind we have numerous students and staff with severe allergies to food and scents. Please refrain from wearing scents when in our school and be diligent about the food items your child brings to school. Nut products cannot be sent to school.

If your child requires medication at school, an Administration of Medicine form must be filled out. All medicine is kept secured and distributed from our main office. Medications are required to be in the original container and clearly labelled by the pharmacy for your child.
