## **Being on Time and School Attendance**

## Proper footwear for physical education

## **Registration Month**

Pre-Primary Registration - Children must be <u>four</u> by December 31<sup>st</sup> 2024 in order to register for preprimary. Registrations can be completed <a href="https://www.hrce.ca/families/student-registration-updates">https://www.hrce.ca/families/student-registration-updates</a> In order for the registration to be complete, you must provide a copy of your child's birth certificate, health card and proof of address.

<u>Primary Registration</u> - Children must be <u>five</u> by December 31<sup>st</sup> 2024 to register for primary. For new students, please visit <a href="https://www.hrce.ca/registration">https://www.hrce.ca/registration</a> to complete the necessary paperwork. For the registration to be complete, you must provide a copy of your child's birth certificate, health card and proof of address.

\*\*\* Important \*\*\* - If your child is currently enrolled in the pre-primary program at Ian Forsyth as an in-bounds student, you are not required to complete a new registration form for primary.

If your child is currently enrolled in pre-primary at lan Forsyth as an Out-of-Area student, you must register for primary at your neighbourhood school. Out-of-Area students in pre-primary are not automatically registered for primary. Out-of-Area students in pre-primary must be registered for primary by completing a registration form for their home school.

The safety and security of our students and staff is a top priority for *Ian Forsyth Elementary* and the Halifax Regional Centre for Education. We have been implementing a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn.

One of the procedures our school will be practicing is a lockdown drill. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured, and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked, and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building.

Students are kept inside the school and classrooms when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they

also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill. These drills should be treated with the same level of importance as fire drills.

Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. When possible, our School Liaison Officer may assist us in conducting the lockdown drills just as the Fire Department assists with evacuation drills.

Please take the time to speak with your child about this procedure and reinforce its importance. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning. We will be holding our 2<sup>nd</sup> lockdown drill on February 13<sup>th</sup>.
