Nova Scotia Oral Health Program for Children

Did you know the *Nova Scotia Children's Oral Health program* covers annual basic dental care for

all children 14 years of age and under with a valid MSI health card?



- Once a year, this includes: • One routine dental exam
- · One fluoride application (2nd may be eligible)
- Two routine x-rays

 \cdot Other preventive services – such as; brushing & flossing instructions, and/or cleaning.

Molar sealants, fillings and necessary extractions are also covered by the program.
